Coordinating Committee Meeting

Monday 4th May 2020 7-30 pm [by Zoom video conference]

Minutes

Present: John Brannan (Convenor), Warren Bond, Denise Hall, Margo Hellyer, Len Taylor, Alana Wilkes

1. Apologies and Welcome

All present. John welcomed the committee to its first video conference meeting and thanked Warren for organizing it.

2. Minutes of the Last Meeting / Business Arising

It was moved by Len and seconded by Denise that the Minutes of the Coordinating Committee meeting held on 10th February 2020 be accepted as a true and fair record of that meeting.

Agreed.

Consideration of Actions carried forward from previous meetings:

20161205: Item 11 (e)

- ii. <u>Member Survey</u>
 - Action: Warren and Margo to draft a survey to determine members' communication preferences.

Some progress but still outstanding.

20170306: Item 14 (b) FOMP – Belconnen Hills Strategy

Action: This item cannot be progressed until PCS has finalised its Landscape Classification Assessment.

Action pending. It is hoped that the finalisation of the Canberra Nature Park Management Plan may allow this to be progressed.

This has now been further delayed because of the COVID-19 disruptions.

20190805: Item 11 (b) Subscribing to National e-deposit (NED)

Action: Warren to follow up and do whatever is required (if anything).

It is thought that we don't need to do anything but Warren will check.

Still pending.

20200210: Item 10 (c) Pipeline corridor restoration

Action: Warren to raise our concerns about plant condition and weed control with the appropriate people who met previously for a site inspection when we first raised concerns in October.

Completed. See further discussion in Item 10 (a)

20200210: Item 10 (d) Clean-up of remaining gravel piles near the tanks

Action: John to follow up.

John contacted Ranger Riko but there has been no action as yet. John will follow up again.

20200210: Item 12 (c) Review of Weed Plan 10 years on

Action: Warren to follow up with Pax and report back

Warren met with Pax in late February and discussed how we might proceed with reviewing the weed plan, including the possibility of repeating the weed survey of 2009 when conditions were right. Subsequent events (strong weed growth, COVID-19 concerns) have delayed further follow up. It will be pursued again in the next few months.

3. Correspondence in and out (Warren) (Attachment A)

Noted.

4. Convenor's Report

John had previously circulated his report which was noted. The main topics were:

- Impact on the Reserve and fotpin of COVID-19 restrictions
- Extraordinary plant growth in response to the very wet late summer and autumn
- Growing number of native flora and fauna species reported on the Reserve, including the recent significant sighting of a Macleay's Grass Yellow butterfly, the first sighting as far south as the A.C.T.
- Revegetation of the Molonglo Watermain corridor
- Weetangera Revegetation Project

5. Treasurer's Report (Attachment B)

Margo's report had been previously circulated and was unanimously accepted

Also circulated was a request from Len Taylor for reimbursement of \$30-52 for expenses associated with the Weetangera revegetation project. **Approved**.

6. Membership Report

Warren reported that our current membership had remained at 98 in the last 3 months, while the net number of other people who have requested to be on our email list increased by 3 to 192, bringing the combined total to 290.

7. Weed Management

Warren reported that the total effort spent on weed control between 1 February and 30 April was the second smallest in our 10 years of records (impacted in part by COVID-19 restrictions). Key targets were was St. John's Wort, Paterson's Curse, Miscellaneous Broadleaf weeds and Saffron Thistles, which comprised 70% of the effort.

Total effort for the season to date was 465 hours, the smallest in our 10 years of records.

8. Information and Outreach

a. Website

Warren reported that there were no major changes to the website in the last three months apart from regular updates to the flora and fauna, weeding and rainfall pages.

The number of unique visitors to the website per month rebounded from a low in the previous 3 months to be about average, largely on the strength of recent interest in walking as a result of COVID-19. The most popular pages in this period were "Walking Tracks", "About

the Pinnacle", "Newsletters", "Recent Weeding", the "Walking" home page, "Plants of the Pinnacle", the "Corridor map", "Flora and Fauna" and the "Photo Gallery" home page.

b. Social Media

Denise reported that we've had 102 likes on our facebook page and that she has just set up a new Instagram account linked to our facebook page.

c. Weetangera Primary School Fete (John)

It is uncertain whether or not this will go ahead as a result of COVID-19 restrictions.

Action: John to ask if a tentative date has been set.

9. Events Program

All autumn events were cancelled as a result of the COVID-19 restrictions.

The planning of spring events will be subject to the speed at which the COVID-19 restrictions are lifted.

10. Molonglo Watermain

a. Corridor restoration follow-up (plant replacement, weed control – current and future)

The weed infestations reported at the last Committee meeting were dealt with by the contractors but the subsequent rainfall resulted in more widespread infestations along the corridor and the sighting of 3 weed species previously not seen on the Reserve: Witchgrass, Barnyard grass and Dwarf Marigold. In the meantime most of the trees, shrubs and native grasses planted along the corridor had died or failed to germinate. These issues were drawn to the attention of the contractors, resulting in a further round of weed control and the commencement of replanting.

Regular monthly site inspections by all parties involved have now been established to review progress and recommend further remedial actions as required. Fotpin was invited to attend these and was represented by Warren at the first one on 24th April. The next is scheduled for 22nd May.

b. Clean-up of remaining gravel piles near the tanks

John raised this with Ranger Riko who responded that discussions were underway to resolve this issue. No further action as yet.

Action: John to follow up.

11. Groundcover Revegetation Project Report

Report on progress of work carried out so far
 Len's report on planting activities to date and the survival rates is attached. (<u>Attachment C</u>)

Key points include the high survival rate of the plantings to date and the progress with propagating new seedlings for planting.

Report noted.

b. Update on proposal for trial of seed broadcast method

An application to Friends of Grasslands for a *2020 Grassy Ecosystem Grant* of \$1150 was prepared by Len and John Brannan and submitted after out of session review and approval by the Committee. An indication of the success of this application is expected by the end of May.

12. Other Business

a. AGM

Under the current COVID-19 restrictions it would not be possible to hold a face-to-face AGM. Even when the restrictions are eased it is likely that many of our members would be unwilling to attend such a meeting. Video conferencing was considered but it was decided that the simplest way to proceed was to ask members to vote to defer the AGM for a year.

The Management Rules require an AGM to be held "once every year", but the only items of business required are confirming the minutes of the previous AGM, electing the Coordinating Committee members for the following year, reviewing the Annual Financial Statement and receiving other reports on fotpin activities. It was agreed that we would ask members to vote by email to approve the deferral of the meeting using the same rules that apply to changing the Management Rules, namely 14 days' notice of the proposal, a quorum (ie the number of votes received) of 10 members and the requirement for a majority of votes in favour. At the same time we would ask members to confirm the minutes of the 2019 AGM and to confirm an extension of all Coordinating Committee members for a further 12 months.

Action: Warren to prepare a notice to members to explain the proposal to defer the 2020 AGM and organize the voting.

b. Fotpin's 10th birthday

It was agreed that celebrations would be postponed until COVID-19 restrictions were lifted and members felt comfortable to mix in large groups again.

- Review of Weed Plan 10 years on
 Warren and Pax had an initial meeting to discuss the way to proceed but it has been put on hold until the COVID-19 restrictions are lifted.
- d. Weed experiment (2010-2012) plots

Issues have arisen over dangerous star pickets in the grazed plots. These were last used by University of Canberra PhD student Andrew O'Reilly-Nugent and Warren contacted him to ascertain that he had finished. The way is now clear to remove the offending items. This also raises the question of whether the grazing exclusion plots have any further use or whether we should plan to have them removed. It was decided to ask Don Driscoll's and John Fitz Gerald's opinions before making any decision.

Action: Warren to contact Don Driscoll for input into future uses of the grazing exclusion plots.

e. Water our wildlife

While the need to provide water for wildlife is now well and truly over, remnant watering containers remain on the Reserve.

It is proposed to put a message on <u>the</u> facebook page reminding people to remove anything they put out and also to mention it in the email accompanying the next Update. We will have to remove any containers that remain a month or so after that.

Action: John and Margot to remind people via facebook and the Update email to remove their remaining watering containers.

13. Proposed date for next meeting

August 3rd 2020 (at John's home provided COVID-19 restrictions permit and members are comfortable with a face to face meeting).

Meeting closed at 9 pm.

Attachment C Weetangera Groundcover Revegetation Project Progress Report

Since the February report only one *Microlaena* has died. There is noticeable difference size and health of the plants, with those in good soil are doing much better than those in poor soil. The use of wire cages was a good since it has allowed the plants to easily deposit seeds outside the cages. This has resulted in new seedlings which are largely protected by the surrounding cages. Where the soil is good this recruitment has been good. I have not counted these additions but they would probably outnumber those that died. It did require a lot of watering over the rather dry Summer to get the parent plants established.

The Daisy plants purchased from Greening Australia were planted at two sites, with 10 at each site. Three died at the site enclosed by plastic guards and one was dug up by rabbits at the other site.

The 297 Red Leg and 7 *Calotis lappulaceae* (Yellow Burr-Daisy) which survived the hail storm were all planted out. Of these 4 Red Leg and one *Calotis lappulaceae* have died.

Interestingly all but one the plants which died (other than being dug up by rabbits) has occurred at the same site, which is now enclosed by plastic guards. The initial small planting of *Microleana* resulted in 19 being lost before we realized that the soil was hydrophobic and treated subsequent planting with soil wetter. So although soil wetter has improved the soil condition it is still not good. As previously stated the rabbits dug up a lot of plants, mainly unguarded *Senecio quadridentatus* and *Vitadinia*. As these are not heavily grazed plants most did not have a guard around them.

Sarah Hnatiuk (Friends of Mt. Painter) has kindly lent us a lot of growing tubes and the carriers for them. The number of plants we germinate is now only limited by the number of hours put into sowing the seeds, germinating them and later planting them out. To speed up sowing we tried sowing seeds directly into the tubes. With Kneed Spear Grass (*Austrostipa bigeniculata*) seeds provided by John Fitzgerald I had a practice sowing of 70 seeds. Then Tim Gill and his two young daughters came in and sowed another 200 tubes which they took away to germinate. Tim says the germination rate has been approximately 80%, which is the same as mine.

We also have another keen member of the revegetation team in Chantal Jackson

Only nine of the Yellow Burr Daisy germinated two of which got too badly damaged by hail that they died.
